20 Kings of Israel

- All were evil in the sight of God
- 8 Died
- 7 Killed
- 1 Stricken by God
- 1 Committed suicide
- 1 Wounded in battle
- 1 Fell to his death
- 1 Exiled
- (only 9 were the sons of the previous king) *

Non-Canonical Prophets

- The following Non-Canonical Prophets prophesied to Israel:
 - Ahijah to Jeroboam promising 10 tribes; sons will die
 - Man of God to Jeroboam destruction of temple at Bethel
 - Lying prophet tricked man of God causing his death
 - Jehu to Baasha house will be destroyed
 - Micaiah to Ahab death of King of Judah in battle
 - Elijah to Ahab
 - Elisha to Joram

Canonical prophets oriented toward Assyria and Israel

- Jonah -prophesied to Assyria and Jeroboam II
- Amos prophesied to Jeroboam II
- Hosea prophesied to Jeroboam II
 - Fall of Israel occurred in 722 BC *

The Book of the Prophet Jonah

Jonah 800-753 BC Pre Exilic

- Was born in a small town about 5 miles north of Nazareth
- Prophesied to *Israel* against *Nineveh* the capital of *Assyria* during the reign of *Jeroboam II* (793-753 B.C.)
- His book is a narrative about a disobedient prophet who evades his divine mission, is redirected, and then complains of its success

Jonah (Cont)

- His focus is on the idea that God desires that all men be saved which represents the Old Testament understanding of the value of repentance
- This concept reflects the type of death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as presented in Mt 12:39-41
 - Jesus says that "one greater than Jonah is here"
 - Jonah will spend three days and three nights in the belly of the whale as will Jesus in the tomb *

The Book of the Prophet Amos

Amos (Cont)

- Was a simple herdsman/shepherd and a dresser of sycamore-trees (not a professional prophet) from Tekoa, a village about five miles south of Bethlehem
- Was called by God to prophesy to the polytheists of Israel at Bethel during the reign of Jeroboam II (783-743) when Israel was wealthy and exploiting the poor
- He condemned corrupt city life, social injustice, the deceitful consolation of insincere ceremonies
- He predicted the salvation of those who stay faithful (the remnant of Joseph)

Amos (Cont)

- He was very important for the early Christians
 - He is quoted in Acts 15 at the first council of the church by the Apostle James, Bishop of Jerusalem
 - Stephen, the first martyr, quotes from Amos in his long speech in Acts 7
- He was called the "firebrand" among the prophets
- He was the first among the canonical prophets to speak about the Gentiles coming into the faith
- He proclaims hope for the faithful who would remain as a remnant (Anawim)

The Book of the Prophet Hosea

Hosea 750-715 BC Pre Ex

Was a native of *Israel*, and the only prophet from *Israel*

Was a contemporary of *Amos*

His ministry began under *Jeroboam II* and continued under his son *Zechariah*

At God's direction he married a prostitute, whom he loved, who later deserted him, and after putting her to the test, he took her back

Hosea (Cont)

Served as the symbol of God's dealing with the faithless people of Israel who were acting like harlots by practicing idolatry Reflects God's anger and jealousy

Demonstrated that even though God's love remains, He must punish Israel in hope of restoring her to the joys of first love Presented a message of salvation

Hosea (Cont)

- Raised in a period of opulence, prosperity, opportunism, and scheming during which the rich and powerful lived in luxury
- Was God's spokesman to the last generation of Israel
- Witnesses the fall of Jehu's dynasty
- Called for absolute loyalty to Yahweh *

20 Kings of Judah

- 12 were evil and 8 were good in the sight of God
- 9 Died
- 5 Killed
- 2 Stricken by God
- 1 Wounded in battle
- 1 Exiled to Egypt
- 2 Exiled to Babylon
- (15 were the sons of the previous king)
