- Born around the 15<sup>th</sup> year of Caesar Augustus (16 B.C.)
- Son of Abraham and Miriam (Mary) who farmed a small plot of land near Bethlehem
- I have an older brother, a younger brother, and two younger sisters

- Abraham (wife Sarah)
  - The Covenant circumcision
  - 3 promises
    - Descendants
    - Land
    - The blessing of the nations

# First Century Worldview

#### Pentateuch - 5

- Genesis
- Exodus
- Leviticus
- Numbers
- Deuteronomy

 Septuagint (LXX) – Greek version of Hebrew scriptures translated in Alexandria, Egypt from 300 to 200 B.C. (In use at the time of Christ)

#### 46 Books:

- Pentateuch 5
- Prophets 18
- Historical 16
- Wisdom 7

- Isaac and Rebecca
  - Esau and Jacob
    - 12 sons
    - Joseph
      - Sold into bondage in Egypt
      - Second to Pharaoh in dealing with 7 year famine
      - Clan of Jacob moves to Egypt for 430 years

# The Story of David bar Abraham (Cont)

- Mother Miriam (Mary), Sister of Moses
- Older Brother Joshua (Jesus), Successor to Moses
- Sister Sarah, Wife of Abraham
- Sister Rebecca, Wife of Isaac
- Younger Brother Benjamin, Last son of Jacob

- Moses (his brother Aaron and sister Miriam)
  - Burning bush and the name of God
  - 10 plagues
  - The Passover
  - Crossing the Red Sea
  - Mt Sinai
    - The Law Kosher
    - Golden Calf
    - Levitical priesthood
    - Covenant (Ex 24:6)

- David and the Kingdom
  - Solomon and the Temple
    - Civil war
    - 20 Kings in North and South
    - The 15 Prophets
    - Assimilation of the North in 722 BC

# David bar Abraham's Story (Cont)

#### Bethlehem in the 1<sup>st</sup> Century

- Tribes of Judah and Benjamin known as "Jews"
- Between 300 and 1000 residents
- Grazing land for the sheep and goats raised for sacrifices

# David bar Abraham's Story (Cont)

#### Family Life in Bethlehem Includes

- Work on a small farm
  - Crops
  - Animals
- Religious education at village Synagogue
- Lived is one room stone house
- The family reclined on the floor for meals

#### Languages:

- Aramaic of the people
- **Hebrew** of the scholars and priest
- Greek of commerce and culture
- Latin of the occupation

#### The Role of The Synagogue

- Place of assembly and prayer and study for the village
- Religious activities included:
  - Readings the Torah and or the Prophets on Sabbath
  - Followed by dialogue and discussion
  - Formal prayers were not a part of the service at the time of Jesus
  - Hebrew schools were often held in the main room of the synagogue

#### Temple Worship

- Every morning and evening a priest enters the **Holy Place** to burn incense (*Zachariah*)
- Every day a priest enters the Holy Place to trim the wicks on the oil lamps (Menorah)
- Once a week a priest enters the Holy Place to change the holy show bread
- Once a year the High Priest enters the <u>Holy of Holies</u> to speak the name of God
- The priests lead the community in prayer three times a day: at daybreak, after noon, in the evening

- Babylonian Captivity 587 BC
- The Fall and destruction of the Temple 538 BC
- The Return and rebuilding of the Temple and Jerusalem 538 BC

#### Political domination:

- Babylon 722-540 B.C.
- Persia 540-336 B.C.
- Greece 336- 63 B.C
- Rome 63 B.C

#### The Role of the Temple

- Political and religious center of Judaism
- Home of the Sanhedrin
  - 70 member council
  - Under the leadership of the High Priest
- Under construction by Herod the Great for 46 years

#### Sanhedrin

- Sadducees
- Pharisees
  - Lawyers
  - Scribes

#### Temple worship

- High Priest
  - Levitical priesthood
    - Aaron's descendants
    - Other Levites
  - Essenes
  - Zealots
