- O-6 A.D. The Birth of Jesus the Christ
- 1-5 Saul (Paul) was born in Tarsus
- 30-33 A.D. Jesus Christ preached the gospel, was crucified, raised and ascended into Heaven
 - Jesus promised the Holy Spirit and commanded the Apostles to be His witness in *Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria* & to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8)
 - The 11 Apostles witnessed the Ascension of Jesus into the Glory "Cloud" (Acts 1:9)
 - Peter spoke to a group of 120 brethren about the death of Judas who was buried in the Field of Blood (Acts 1:15-20
 - Mathias was selected by casting lots to replace Judas (Acts 1:21-25)

- 33 A.D. The early church experienced Pentecost & the descent of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-47)
 - Tongues of fire
 - Message heard in multitude of languages
 - Peter chastised the Jews and called them to repentance and baptism
 - 3000 Jews from the world entered the Church of Jerusalem
- The Apostles understood that their task from Jesus was to spread the "Good News" (Evangelium)
 - This became knowns as the "Kerygma" (Read Acts 2:14-43)



 - 12 Apostles
- 120 Jews/ Proselytes (Acts 1:15)
- 3000 Jews/ Proselytes (Acts 2:41)
- 5000 Jews/Proselytes (Acts 4:4)
- 2.18 Billion Christians by 2010



Summary of the Kerygma

- The promises of God made in the OT have now been fulfilled with the coming of Jesus, the Messiah
- Jesus was anointed by God at his baptism as Messiah
- Jesus began his ministry in Galilee after his baptism
- He conducted a beneficent ministry, doing good and performing mighty works by the power of God
- The Messiah was crucified according to the purpose of God
- He was raised from the dead and appeared to his disciples
- Jesus was exalted by God and given the name "Lord"
- He gave the Holy Spirit to form the new community of God
- He will come again for judgment and the restoration of all things
- All who hear the message should repent and be baptized

- Peter and John (Acts 3:1 5:11)
 - Healed the man lame from birth
 - Preached within Solomon's Portico
 - Were arrested by the Sanhedrin and thrown into prison
 - 5000 who heard the word joined the Church
 - The next day they defended their actions before the Sanhedrin who released them with a warning not to speak or preach in "the name of Jesus"
 - They reported this to the Church of Jerusalem who then decided to entrust everything and live in a communal setting (Acts 2:46; 4:32-5:11)
 - Barnabas gave the community a piece of land
 - Ananias and Sapphira withheld part of their sale and after lying to the Apostles and the elders were struck dead

- The Apostles returned to preaching in Solomon's Portico (Acts 5:12-16)
- The high priest and Sadducees were filled with jealousy and arrested them again (Acts 5:17-19)
- That night they were freed from prison by an angel and returned to preach in the Temple (Acts 5:19-21)
- They were again brought before the high priest and the Sanhedrin who wanted to kill them (Acts 5:21-32)
- A most respected Pharisee named Gamaliel convinced the Council to spare them as possibly being from God (Acts 5:33-42)

- A division arose within the early Church between the treatment of Hellenist and Hebrew widows (Acts 6:1-6)
 - The Apostles selected 7 deacons to assist in ministering to the widows allowing them to focus on preaching the Gospel
- Deacon Stephen was: (Acts 6:8 8:1)
 - One of the seven, filled with zeal and preached to the Jews
 - Charged with blasphemy and taken before the Council for a trial
 - Stoned and martyred in front of Saul of *Tarsus*

- The Jews began a great persecution of the Church in Jerusalem scattering the believers (except for the Apostles) throughout *Judea* and *Samaria* (Acts 8:1-3)
- Deacon Philip (Acts 8:4-40):
 - Took the Gospel to Samaria causing Peter and John to visit and lay hands on the believers in order for them to receive the Holy Spirit
 - Converted and Baptized an Ethiopian minister on the Road to
 Gaza
 - Continued to Caesarea preaching the gospel

- Peter and John healed a man lame from birth within the Temple and preached to the people from Solomon's Portico
 - This resulted in 5000 men joining the Church
 - Peter and John were taken into custody overnight, then taken before the Sanhedrin and later released with only a verbal reprimand
- Church of *Jerusalem* decided to live in a "communal" setting
 - Barnabas gave the community a parcel of land
 - Ananias and Sapphira withheld part of their profits, lied to the community and were died suddenly

- 33-37 A.D. Saul's persecution of the Church and his conversion (Acts 8:2-9:30) Saul:
 - Began persecuting the early Church in Jerusalem and was given a letter from the Sanhedrin to persecute the believers in *Damascus*
 - Was struck down and blinded on the Road to Damascus
 - Regained his sight by the laying on of the hands of Ananias
 - Was baptized
 - Had to flee after the Jews plotted against him
 - Spent 3 years on a sojourn and meditation in Arabia
 - Returned to *Damascus* where the Jews ploted to kill him
 - Fled by night to *Jerusalem*
 - Was supported by Barnabas before the Church of Jerusalem
 - Was moved to *Caesarea* and then on to *Tarsus* (Acts 9:1-30)

- The Church throughout *Judea, Galilee* & *Samaria* was at peace (Acts 9:31)
- Peter (Acts 9:32 11:18)
 - Traveled to Lydda where he healed a man paralyzed for eight years by calling on the name of Jesus Christ
 - Moved on to *Joppa* and raised a woman from the dead named *Tabitha*
 - Stayed at the house of Simon the tanner in Joppa
 - Dreamed of a sheet containing animals descending from heaven and was instructed to kill and eat
 - Initially, he refused to eat as he had never eaten anything "unclean"
 - Was told not to declare what God had deemed "clean" to be "unclean"
 - Was visited by a delegation from the house of the Roman Centurion *Cornelius*

- Went with the delegation from *Cornelius*, along with 6 of his disciples, to *Caesarea*
- Converted and baptized Cornelius and his household
- Returned to *Jerusalem* were he was challenged by the "circumcision party"
 - His counter argument silenced his distractors
