Pastor's Corner

Third Sunday of Lent. As Lent continues I encourage you all to let yourself enter more fully into the holiness of this season. Some of you may not have really turned your full attention to the penitence of the season yet, and some of you may be starting to wane in your sincere efforts. All that is understandable, but we must not let this great opportunity to draw closer to Christ slip away.

In this regard I urge you to pause every night before you go to bed and briefly examine your consciences, thinking both of your sins and of God's blessings of the day. Also take a moment to consider how you well you "kept Lent" that day.

I also encourage you to carefully review the Lenten Schedule we distributed two weeks ago (go to *straymonds.org* and click "*Lent*" at the top of the home page) and think about which of the various Lenten liturgies and activities you should take part in—and resolve to make it happen.

Looking over the schedule, I see the daily confessions—have you been yet? And the Friday Stations of the Cross—such a simple but profound devotion. Or maybe you can come to Exposition and Adoration on Wednesday or Friday. Or how about waking up early once a week to come to morning Mass before work or school, or to the Extraordinary Form Mass on the 1st and 3rd Fridays. Or go to Mass at another church during lunch. Or maybe listen to my daily Lenten Podcast.

Don't let this opportunity to grow in holiness pass you by. Keep the love of Christ Crucified before your eyes at all times, so that your hearts may be transformed every day in Lent.

FORMED.ORG. Another great tool in Lent is the website FORMED.ORG. The website, run by the Augustine Institute in Denver, describes itself, quite accurately as: "a revolutionary online platform featuring the best Catholic videos, audio talks, eBooks and movies from trusted partners like the Augustine Institute, St. Paul Center, Marian Fathers, Lighthouse Catholic Media, Ignatius Press and Word on Fire. Catechism and Personal Faith Formation are at the fingertips of every parishioner." There's something good for the little ones, teens, middle-aged, seniors, neophytes, cradle Catholics, well-educated, not so well-educated, families, marrieds, singles, men, women—everyone. It really is great. Go to the site and see for yourself.

RCIA and RCIC. Please keep in prayer those adults and children who are preparing to enter the Catholic Church and/or be Baptized, Confirmed and receive First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. Even with the restriction of Covid they have been preparing diligently the last few months. Let us pray that they persevere in faith, and be open to all the graces God has in store for them. And may they be an example to the rest of us, reminding each of us of our own continuing need for personal conversion in the love of Christ.

New Vaccine. Bishop Kevin Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, chairman of the Bishops' Committee on Doctrine, and Archbishop Joseph Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, have issued a statement *(see below)* on the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine recently approved for use in the United States. Both are very good men, and their advice is sound.

"The approval of Johnson & Johnson's COVID-19 vaccine for use in the United States again raises questions about the moral permissibility of using vaccines developed, tested, and/or produced with the help of abortion-derived cell lines.

"Pfizer and Moderna's vaccines raised concerns

because an abortion-derived cell line was used for testing them, but not in their production. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine, however, was developed, tested and is produced with abortion-derived cell lines raising additional moral concerns. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has judged that 'when ethically irreproachable Covid-19 vaccines are not available ... it is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines that have used cell lines from aborted fetuses in their research and production process.' However, if one can choose among equally safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines, the vaccine with the least connection to abortion-derived cell lines should be chosen. Therefore, if one has the ability to choose a vaccine, Pfizer or Moderna's vaccines should be chosen over Johnson & Johnson's.

"While we should continue to insist that pharmaceutical companies stop using abortion-derived cell lines, given the world-wide suffering that this pandemic is causing, we affirm again that being vaccinated can be an act of charity that serves the common good."

I would only add that each person must judge, according to one's own conscience, that there is a grave reason to take the vaccine—the CDF, referenced above, thinks there is, but some disagree. In no case are you required to take the vaccine: you are free to choose, following the Church's teaching and guidance. If you choose to take the vaccine, you should still make your objections known. For this you might want to see the sample letter on our website, on the "coronavirus" menu at the top of the front page.

New Altar Rail and Pulpit. On June 23, 2019, I announced plans to install a new marble altar rail and pulpit. Twenty months later, after multiple delays due to Covid—in the workshops in Italy and Maryland, and the ports in Italy, Bahamas, Miami and Baltimore, it's finally in place. Praised be Jesus Christ! And Our Lady of Ransom and St. Raymond.

Thanks to all the donors who made this possible; you'll be happy to know we had more than enough donations to pay for the project (I'll be in touch with donors about this soon). Thanks to the craftsmen who made and installed it all so beautifully. And thanks to all of you for your patience. I hope you like it, and pray that it will add to our reverent and devout celebration of the Holy Mass.

Parents' Rights. On December 23, the District of Columbia enacted a law allowing children age 11 and older to obtain vaccines without their parents' consent. Doctors will determine if their minor patients meet the standard for informed consent. The legislation also requires doctors to "seek reimbursement, without parental consent, directly from the insurer" and "submit the immunization record directly to the minor's school," rather than their parents. So, doctors, not parents, are in charge of our kids. Parents' rights be damned. Although the law only applies to the District, this kind of thing, as we have so often seen lately, spreads like the virus. Beware.

Welcome Back Fr. Daly! After several months of Covid shutdown in his retirement community, Fr. Daly is back with us today, celebrating the 1pm Mass. I can't tell you how happy both he and I are about his return. At 89 years he's a real trooper, a great example to all of us, especially to us priests. Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fasting and abstinence, and every Friday in Lent is a day of abstinence. Failure to "substantially" keep these penances is grave matter (e.g., potentially a mortal sin). The <u>law of abstinence</u> requires that no meat may be eaten on these days, and binds all Catholics who are 14 years old or older. No other penance may be substituted. The <u>law of fasting</u> binds those who are <u>between</u> the ages of 18 and 59. The Church defines "fasting," for these purposes, as having only one full meal a day, with two additional smaller meals permitted, but only as necessary to keep up strength and so small that if added together they would not equal a full meal. Snacking is forbidden, but that does not include drinks that are not of the nature of a meal. Even though these rules do not bind all age groups, all are encouraged to follow them to the extent possible. Children in particular learn the importance of penance from following the practice of their older family members. The sick, pregnant or nursing mothers, and other folks with special physical circumstances may be partially or totally exempt from these rules—use good judgment and take care of yourself.

GOSPEL JN 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen. sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. and to those who sold doves He said, "Take these out of here. and stop making My Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to Him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking about the temple of His body. Therefore, when He was raised from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While He was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. many began to believe in His name when they saw the signs He was doing. But Jesus would not trust Himself to them because He knew them all. and did not need anyone to testify about human nature.

Church Persecuted

Much has been written about the damage that the Equality Act can do to religious organizations (see Father DeCelles' columns in previous bulletins). There are several other executive orders, cabinet-level directives, and pending bills in Congress which also can eliminate or severely restrict the First Amendment religious protection afforded to religious organizations, and in particular Catholic colleges and schools. The information below is extracted from a recent memorandum The Cardinal Newman Society sent to Catholic school, college, and diocesan leaders.

Executive Order 13988 on Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity (SOGI) was signed by President Biden on his first day in office. This pertains to the Supreme Court's Bostock ruling finding that:

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Fair Housing Act, and other laws include "transgender" and homosexuality within the scope of sex discrimination. Among other things, the Order could require that children share restrooms and locker rooms with those of a different birth gender, and that biological males be permitted to participate on female athletic teams.

What we see here is the Biden administration "covering as many bases as possible" (author's words) so they may be able to force this immoral discrimination into the public square. (Continued next week)

The Search Episode 4 - What's Our Story? Your life is a story. And it's caught up in the great story of humanity. This great story, as we see it in the Scriptures, shows us the amazing love story that is God's pursuit of man. The God that is love created us so we can ultimately be with His love. We were made to be with God. Union with God is so central to the purpose of life, we even see the afterlife in these terms. Our definition of Heaven is union with God, and hell is absence of Him.
