Pastor's Corner

ABOUT THE CANDIDATES. Voting is the most fundamental building block of our nation, and the foundation of all our freedoms. But so many of us don't bother to vote, and when the rest of us do vote, we often vote based on very little knowledge of the candidates, and over secondary issues. Sometimes we even vote based on some irrelevant attribute of the candidate: e.g., their looks, color, education, and especially political party. All this, instead of finding out what the candidates plan to do in office and where they stand on the most important issues on the table.

And by "the most important issues," I don't mean our pet projects, but the issues that are most fundamental in maintaining a moral and free society.

Virginia State and local elections are now only <u>9 days</u> <u>away, Tuesday, November 2</u> (although you can still vote-early-inperson). Sadly, many Virginians will not vote in this so-called "off year election," even though it will decide who will write most of the laws and policies that govern our daily lives, especially the lives of our children, as we elect a new Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, and State Delegate.

But where do the candidates stand on the most important issues facing us? Some issues may be very important but are open to debate as to the best solution. So let's consider the issues that are really not up for debate for Catholics in the coming election.

Governor's Race. Let's begin with the race between Teny McAuliffe (Democrat) and Glenn Youngkin (Republican) for Governor of Virginia.

Abortion. Terry <u>McAuliffe is pro-abortion</u> on demand, even supporting an amendment to the Constitution of Virginia that permanently enshrines the right to abortion. Glenn <u>Youngkin is pro-life</u>, although he supports exceptions for rape, incest and when the life of the mother is at risk.

Parental Rights in Education. McAuliffe says, "I don't think parents should be telling schools what they should teach." Youngkin says, "I believe parents should be in charge of their kids' education," and advocates school choice for parents.

Critical Race Theory in Public Schools. McAuliffe says that "it's not taught in Virginia" and that it is just "another rightwing conspiracy." Youngkin says, "On day one, I will issue an order banning the teaching of critical race theory in our schools."

Transgenderism in Public Schools. McAuliffe has pledged to "implement the Virginia Department of Education's new model policy to protect and affirm transgender students," which states, "All students are entitled to have access to restrooms, locker rooms, and changing facilities that corresponds to their gender identity." Youngkin opposes these policies. When asked, "As governor are you going to allow male students to participate in girls' high school athletics and shower with them?" Youngkin responded, "No... we've just lost our whole sense of common sense."

Covid Vaccine Mandates. McAuliffe supports requiring the vaccine for students, teachers and health care workers and supports businesses requiring them for employees. Youngkin encourages everyone to be vaccinated but opposes mandates, saying "...individuals should be allowed to make that decision on their own." (Both Candidates have taken the vaccine themselves).

Delegate's Race. Our parishioners live in various Delegate Districts, so it's not practical to give a complete rundown. But let me say this about the Candidates for District 42, in which the church is located. It is safe to say that on the issues above, the incumbent, **Kathy Tran**, holds the same basic positions as does McAuliffe, and her challenger, **Ed McGoven**, holds the same basic positions as Youngkin. You will remember that in her first term,

Kathy Tran introduced a bill that would allow late term abortion, even as "a woman is about to give birth." This is just evil.

Can a Priest Endorse a Candidate? Our Bishop prohibits priests from endorsing candidates. This seems a good idea, since *some priests are nuts*. But, based on the above critical issues, the choices seem obvious. Just vote like a Catholic!

You Must Vote! I am confident in saying, if you are eligible to vote, it is a grave sin not to vote in this election: we cannot let the radical leftists and secularists destroy our culture, society and families. We must elect officials who will represent us and the principles that have made our state and nation great.

I THOUGHT THIS COULDN'T HAPPEN... As was reported in multiple media outlets last week (this taken from the Daily Wire):

Loudoun County Public Schools in Northern Virginia is being accused of covering up allegations that a boy in late May sexually assaulted a ninth grade girl in her school's restroom—the nightmare scenario so often described by opponents of radical transgender school policies.

The school system allegedly covered up the incident by transferring the male student to a neighboring school where police said he was arrested after sexually assaulting another student.

In a statement to The Daily Signal on Wednesday, Loudoun County Public Schools defended itself from accusations that it improperly handled two sexual assaults in its school buildings...

"Loudoun County Public Schools is aware of the media and social media reports concerning alleged sexual assaults at two of our high school campuses," the official statement says. "... Loudoun County Sheriff's Office was contacted within minutes of receiving the initial report on May 28" LCPS does not begin its investigation until law enforcement advises LCPS that it has completed the criminal investigation...LCPS has cooperated and continues to cooperate with law enforcement."...

The victim's father, Scott Smith, told The Daily Wire that in late May, a boy dressed in a skirt entered a girl's restroom at Stone Bridge High School in Ashburn, Virginia, and sexually assaulted his ninth grade daughter. The suspect in the case was "gender-fluid," Rosiak reported.

Police arrested Smith during a Loudoun County School Board meeting June 22 where he and others voiced their disapproval of the school system's new policy on transgender students. He eventually was sentenced to 10 days in jail, all of it suspended, for disorderly conduct and resisting arrest. Video footage shows police officers dragging the distraught and bloodied father from the school board meeting....

Police confirmed two reports of sexual assaults at Loudoun schools, in May and in October. Smith's attorney...told Fox News that both assaults were committed by the same person, although the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office would not confirm that fact...since the suspect is a juvenile....

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office confirmed...that the Stone Bridge High School assault case was reported to the Loudoun County school resource officer on May 28 by school personnel.

The school district quietly transferred the teenage suspect to Broad Run High School after the alleged assault, Rosiak reported...

That suggests that LCPS Superintendent Scott Ziegler may have lied when he said at the June 22 school board meeting that "the predator transgender student or person simply does not exist," adding: "We don't have any record of assaults occurring in our restrooms."

NEW Inclement Weather Policy

In the event of Weather or Emergency closings, St. Raymond's Parish will NO LONGER follow Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) decisions.

In the event of Weather or other Emergency situations, notice of cancellations or closings of parish events and/or facilities will be posted to the parish website. If possible/practical the parish will also send out an email to all parishioners notifying them of the closing/cancellations.

There are only TWO exceptions to any closing decisions we make and issue:

- 1) Regularly scheduled Masses and Confession will NEVER be cancelled due to inclement Weather.
- 2) Meetings of very small groups that receive the pastor's personal permission, in which case members will be notified of the exception personally by their group leader.

Church Persecuted

This past week, Senate Democrats rolled out their FY 2022 funding priorities. This is a wish list of programs that they desire to fund or restrict the funding of. Missing from the list for the first time in decades are two bipartisan amendments dealing with abortion.

The first is the Hyde Amendment named after Rep. Henry Hyde, a staunch pro-life congressman from Illinois. The Amendment was first enacted in 1976, and it prohibited the use of federal Medicaid funds to be used for elective abortions.

The second is the Weldon Amendment which was introduced by Rep. David Weldon from Florida in 2004. This Amendment protected the conscience rights of health care workers and insurance plans that did not want to participate in certain medical procedures that went against their consciences. These included performing, or participating in the performance of, an abortion or sterilization as well as the administration of contraceptives, sex-change surgery, etc.

Catholic leaders, their bishops and others have denounced the Biden administration's blatant disregard for the dignity of an unborn person. Sadly, this was one of President Biden's major agenda items when he came into office. Ironically, he voted for these Amendments each year when he was in Congress. It has become a litmus test for running for office as a Democrat in virtually every level of government.

The House of Mercy (HOM) is accepting donations of clothing and small household items that can fit in regular trash bags. Halloween and Thanksgiving decorations can be donated from now until December 18 and Christmas decorations can be donated from November 1 until January 22. 
