Pastor's Corner

Election Results. Praised by Jesus Christ! At last Virginia has a pro-life, pro-family, pro-religious freedom Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, and House of Delegates. Thank you all for your prayers, involvement and votes for the Commonwealth, for the love of God and neighbor. Especially our kids.

But keep praying and working. Elections are one thing, governing and legislating is another. The next challenge begins.

Eternal Life. November began with celebrating All Saints and All Souls Days. Going forward in this last month of the Church's year (Advent begins the new year) we continue to contemplate the life after death, especially by praying for the Souls in Purgatory, but also in the readings and prayers of the Mass. So I thought it might be helpful today to briefly review the Church's teaching on this life.

From THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

THE PARTICULAR JUDGMENT

1021 Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts speak of a final destiny of the soul--a destiny which can be different for some and for others.

1022 Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven-through a purification or immediately, -- or immediate and everlasting damnation...

HEAVEN

1023 Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God for ever, for they "see him as he is," face to face:

"By virtue of our apostolic authority, we define the following: According to the general disposition of God, the souls of all the saints . . . and other faithful who died after receiving Christ's holy Baptism (provided they were not in need of purification when they died, . . . or, if they then did need or will need some purification, when they have been purified after death, . . .) already before they take up their bodies again and before the general judgment - and this since the Ascension of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ into heaven - have been, are and will be in heaven, in the heavenly Kingdom and celestial paradise with Christ, joined to the company of the holy angels..." [Benedict XII, Benedictus Deus (1336)]

1024 This perfect life with the Most Holy Trinity - this communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed - is called "heaven." Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness.

1025 To live in heaven is "to be with Christ "

1026 By his death and Resurrection, Jesus Christ has "opened" heaven to us. The life of the blessed consists in the full and perfect possession of the fruits of the redemption accomplished by Christ. He makes partners in his heavenly glorification those who have

believed in him and remained faithful to his will. Heaven is the blessed community of all who are perfectly incorporated into Christ.

1027 This mystery of blessed communion with God and all who are in Christ is beyond all understanding and description. Scripture speaks of it in images: life, light, peace, wedding feast, wine of the kingdom, the Father's house, the heavenly Jerusalem, paradise: "no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him."

1028 ...God ...himself opens up his mystery to man's immediate contemplation... The Church calls this contemplation of God in his heavenly glory "the beatific vision."...

THE FINAL PURIFICATION, OR PURGATORY

1030 All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

1031 The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire...

1032 This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." [2 Macc 12:46] From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead...

HELL

1033 We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against him, against our neighbor or against ourselves: "He who does not love remains in death. Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him." Our Lord warns us that we shall be separated from him if we fail to meet the serious needs of the poor and the little ones who are his brethren. To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called "hell."

1034 Jesus often speaks of "Gehenna" of "the unquenchable fire" reserved for those who to the end of their lives refuse to believe and be converted, where both soul and body can be lost. Jesus solemnly proclaims that he "will send his angels, and they will gather . . . all evil doers, and throw them into the furnace of fire,"[Mt 13:41-42] and that he will pronounce the condemnation: "Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire!"[Mt 25:41]

1035 The teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity. Immediately after death the souls of those who die in a state of mortal sin descend into hell, where they suffer the punishments of hell, "eternal fire." The chief punishment of hell is eternal separation from God, in whom alone man can possess the life and happiness for which he was created and for which he longs.

St. Raymond 2021-22 Snow Team: Your Parish needs your HELP! St. Raymond's is seeking industrious, able-bodied persons to join the 2021-22 Snow Removal Team. NEW Inclement Weather Policy

In the event of Weather or Emergency closings, St. Raymond's Parish will NO LONGER follow Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) decisions.

In the event of Weather or other Emergency situations, notice of cancellations or closings of parish events and/or facilities will be posted to the parish website. If possible/practical the parish will also send out an email to all parishioners notifying them of the closing/cancellations.

There are only TWO exceptions to any closing decisions we make and issue:

1) Regularly scheduled Masses and Confession will NEVER be cancelled due to inclement Weather.

2) Meetings of very small groups that receive the pastor's personal permission, in which case members will be notified of the exception personally by their group leader.

Church Persecuted

Most years, the Little Sisters of the Poor are in the parish asking for donations for their mission of serving the poor through their elder-care homes throughout the United States. Behind the fervor of their mission is a pursuit of justice even against seemingly insurmountable odds. The Little Sisters were thrown into a battle that they did not want - the contraceptive mandate of the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare). They were sued by the Obama administration because they refused to comply with the Act, which exempted churches, but not faith-based ministries.

They pursued the case to the U.S. Supreme Court where the court directed the Obama administration to settle this case and "arrive at an approach going forward." The administration let it lapse to the Trump administration, which updated the regulations and expanded the religious exemption to include religious nonprofit organizations (The Little Sisters being one of them).

That didn't sit well with the attorney generals from two states run by Democratic governors who obtained a further injunction stopping the enforcement of the new rule. Pennsylvania and California sued the Federal government and both the 3rd and 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled against the Sisters. They went to the Supreme Court again and on July 8, 2020, the court ruled 7-2 in their favor.

"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 5:10). Blessed are the Little Sisters for giving us an example of the pursuit of righteousness.
