Pastor's Corner

A Fascinating Talk by Father Tad Pacholczyk. Next Saturday, September 16, I'm very excited to welcome back nationally renowned bio-ethicist, Father Tad Pacholczyk for the 13th straight year. This year his topic is: **The Ethics of Transhumanism, Human Genetic Modification, and Age-Extension Technologies.**

Now, that's a mouthful, and you might not recognize it as a "current hot issue"—but it is. **I think this is the next big thing in the world of morals and science: and it's happening NOW!**

Transhumanists believe that the human race can evolve beyond its current physical and mental limitations, especially by means of science and technology, into a post-human state or "superior species." In recent years, very wealthy individuals such as Google co-founder Larry Page and Amazon founder Jeff Bezos have invested heavily in anti-aging research and related gene-editing and age-extension technologies.

What would be the implications of suddenly finding ourselves freed from many of our current bodily constraints and greatly extending our lifetimes? Can humans become immortal? Should they try? The human desire for transcendence and immortality seems to be embedded in our human nature, but what about the prospect of a technologized human existence as envisioned in sci-fi movies and novels like *A Brave New World*, *Blade Runner*, and *The Matrix*?

Fr. Tad will delve into these emerging technologies which promise to enhance human capabilities, reverse chronic diseases and extend human lifespans. He will examine them from various ethical angles and reflect on the potential benefits and problems posed by the transhumanism project. Father Tad will look at what constitutes a healthy Christian attitude towards science, and whether we can be "saved" through the advances of technology.

There are tremendous positive aspects of this technology, but also huge problems. Think of the potential for the most grotesque abuses, affecting every aspect of your lives and the lives of your children and all their descendants. The potential for the quest for the super race, and its implication for racism, agism, and other forms of terrible discrimination. God created man: can we re-create man? Or some other gross distortion of man?

Father Tad Pacholczyk received his Ph.D. in neuroscience from Yale, and then went on for graduate study of theology in Rome, where he was ordained a priest. He is now an ethicist at the National Catholic Bioethics Center.

You won't want to miss this thought-provoking conversation on science, philosophy, and our faith! **HIGH SCHOOL and COLLEGE age kids are welcome!** Saturday, September 16, 10am, after 9am Mass and 9:30 Rosary.

Schedule Additions. Beginning Wednesday, September 13, the following Mass and Confession times are added to our schedule:

- Every Wednesday evening: Mass at 7pm (after Benediction);
- Every Sunday morning: Confessions ½ hour before 9 and 11am Masses, i.e., 8:30- 9am, 10:30-11am
- Every First Friday during Nocturnal Adoration: Confessions 3-4pm and 6-8pm.

A note about Sunday Confessions. Please remember that it may happen that on particular Sundays, these confessions may be cancelled when no priest is available. Also, confessions should normally end once Mass has begun (the priest may sometimes extend this, but that should not be taken for granted, and they should never go later than the start of the Gospel).

Also, while all are welcome, **these confession times are provided specifically to meet the genuine needs of those who truly cannot attend on other days**, especially for those who

have a specific need to go to confession before Sunday Mass. This means you should not plan to go to confession on Sunday merely because it is more convenient than some other day/time, or to make a merely devotional confession. Parents, in particular, if you follow the admirable practice of monthly family confessions, please do this on Saturdays or Wednesdays, but not on Sunday mornings. And little children, in particular, would probably not have a genuine need to go to confession at this time. Of course, if the line is short on Sunday, then certainly anyone should feel free to take advantage, but if the line is longer, be considerate of others with a genuine need.

New Staff. Over the years I have asked more and more from our office staff, and their hard work has helped us to be the ever-active parish we are. But they work too hard, so I'm delighted to welcome Dominique Murray to our parish staff, as a part-time Office Assistant. Dominique is a long-time parishioner who has been heavily involved as a volunteer since the Holy Fire Hall days (i.e., before the church was built). And she also worked professionally for us with the team of architects who designed our beautiful church. I particularly appreciate her work collaborating with Fr. Gould and other parishioners in designing the beautiful interior of the church. Originally from Quebec, Dominique also spent much of her youth in Texas, so she's got that going for her (I am also a Texan, with French Canadian/Quebecois ancestry). She is an architecture graduate of the University of Houston. Besides her substantial experience in architecture she has also worked as a Thermal Digital Imaging technician. She will be a great addition to our staff. Please keep her in your prayers.

Choir and Schola. Welcome back to our Choir at 11:00 Mass next week. You know summer's over when you hear the beautiful strains of choral singing showering down on us from the choir loft. I hope the choir members had a restful summer, and I look forward to their assistance at Mass.

Church Persecuted

St. Raymond’s has a robust program to convince families to move their children out of the Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) and into Catholic schools. While the “hot button” topics include the family life education program, equity, diversity and inclusion, and critical race theory, the school system’s focus on these topics sometimes requires other basic skills to slide by the wayside.

Cursive is no longer taught in the school system. Spelling is no longer important according to one FCPS teacher. One parent complained to the teacher when a child came home with misspelled words all over the page. The child said, “We don’t get deductions on papers for misspelled words.” The parent met with the teacher who said, “We are more concerned about content and context.” The context of the comments was that this same parent saw the beautiful cursive writing of a Catholic school student and perfectly spelled words on a paper from a first grader in Catholic school. So there are students who are still learning to spell and use words correctly in sentences!

The FCPS parent, though, told the teacher that “My standards are that my children learn how to correctly spell and use words in sentences and I’ll teach them cursive myself.” After all, parents are responsible for the education of their children and not the state. The state (and the Church) has a responsibility to support the parents in that role. It’s time that parents wrest the schools’ leadership away from the teachers union and the school board and take control. One way to do that is to elect school board members (this November) who put the parents first and not the interests of teachers/administrators/unions.




