Pastor's Corner

Happy Easter! The Octave of Easter is over, but the Season of Easter, or "**Eastertide**," continues until the Feast of Pentecost on May 19. That means 50 days of Easter! This reminds us of the 40 days the Risen Jesus walked the Earth and taught his apostles and disciples, until he ascended bodily to heaven on the 40th day, and then the following days of preparing for the coming of the Holy Spirit. The length of the season reminds us that Christ is still risen, and is with us always, and that we share in the life of the Risen Christ through our baptism.

Bishop Burbidge Here Next Sunday. Our Bishop will be here next Sunday, April 21, to celebrate the 11am Mass. There will be a small reception afterwards in the parish hall. (No special occasion or reason for his visit, he just wants to visit his people and priests).

Dignitatis Infinita. This last Monday the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith issued the declaration *Dignitatis Infinita (DI)*, applying the Church's constant teaching on the dignity of human beings to many of the current moral issues facing Christians and all society. I have only begun to read the document, so I don't have a lot to say about it. However, it addresses with particular clarity the issue of "transgenderism" or "gender theory":

"....respect for both one's own body and that of others is crucial in light of the proliferation of claims to new rights advanced by gender theory. This ideology 'envisages a society sexual differences, thereby without eliminating the anthropological basis of the family.' It thus becomes unacceptable that 'some ideologies of this sort...manage to assert themselves as absolute and unquestionable, even dictating how children should be raised. It needs to be emphasized that *'biological sex and the socio-cultural role of sex (gender) can be* distinguished but not separated." Therefore, all attempts to obscure reference to the ineliminable sexual difference between man and woman are to be rejected: 'We cannot separate the masculine and the feminine from God's work of creation, which is prior to all our decisions and experiences, and where biological elements exist which are impossible to ignore.' Only by acknowledging and accepting this difference in reciprocity can each person fully discover themselves, their dignity, and their identity.'

Abortion and Politics. This week presidential candidate and **former-President Trump** released his position on 2 important Pro-Life issues: "In vitro fertilization" and federal legislation to restrict abortion access. Here is an excerpt:

"We want to make it easier for mothers and families to have babies, not harder. That includes supporting the availability of fertility treatments like IVF in every state in America.

"...Many people have asked me what my position is on abortion and abortion rights, especially since I was proudly the person responsible for the endingRoe v. Wade....

"It must be remembered that the Democrats are the radical ones on this position because they support abortion up to and even beyond the ninth month...

"My view is now that we have abortion where everybody wanted it from a legal standpoint. The states will determine by vote or legislation or perhaps both, and whatever they decide must be the law of the land. In this case, the law of the state....

"At the end of the day this is all about the will of the people. You must follow your heart, or in many cases your religion or your faith. Do what's right for your family ...for yourself, ...for your children,for our country, and vote ... "Like Ronald Reagan, I am strongly in favor of exceptions for rape, incest and life of the mother

"...but we must win. We have to win. We are a failing nation, but we can be a failing nation no longer. ..."

So, first, **he's very wrong on IVF**, the Church clearly teaches this is always grossly immoral.

What about **leaving abortion laws to the states**. I think Trump is correct in claiming credit for ending the false national "right to abortion." But now the question is how and where to legislate to stop abortion. Should it done by a federal law, or state law? Should it be an absolute total ban, from conception on and including rape or incest? Should restrictions be phased in gradually, or immediately?

First consider what **St. Thomas Aquinas** (ST I-II, q. 93, a. 3, ad 3) says about legislating against evil:

"Human law is said to permit certain things, not as approving them, but as being unable to direct them. And many things are directed by the Divine law, which human law is unable to direct, because more things are subject to a higher than to a lower cause. Hence the very fact that human law does not meddle with matters it cannot direct, comes under the ordination of the eternal law. It would be different, were human law to sanction what the eternal law condemns. Consequently it does not follow that human law is not derived from the eternal law, but that it is not on a perfect equality with it."

So, the law cannot "sanction" or "approve" evil (i.e., the law cannot affirmatively support abortion, as did *Roe*) but it can permit evil, and not legislate against evil if it is "unable to." The law may justly tolerate some moral evils, but cannot approve of them or establish a right to commit them.

Therefore, while all abortions are evil, in our society it might not be possible, and so not absolutely required, to outlaw all abortions.

Then consider what Pope **St. John Paul II** wrote in *Evangelium Vitae* (73):

"In the case of ...a law permitting abortion or euthanasia, it is therefore never licit to obey it, or to 'take part in a propaganda campaign in favour of such a law, or vote for it.' A particular problem of conscience can arise in cases where a legislative vote would be decisive for the passage of a more restrictive law, aimed at limiting the number of authorized abortions, in place of a more permissive law already passed or ready to be voted on.....In a case like the one just mentioned...an elected official, whose absolute personal opposition to procured abortion was well known, could licitly support proposals aimed at limiting the harm done by such a law and at lessening its negative consequences at the level of general opinion and public morality."

Therefore, it would seem that Trumps position is not necessarily immoral, and one may agree with, actively support or merely tolerate it, as long as one continues to strive to move society to stand against the evil of abortion.

On the other hand, based on all this, **President Biden's** continuing support for pro-abortion laws and the "fundamental right to abortion" clearly constitute what St. Thomas calls "sanctioning" or "approving" of evil, and falls under the condemnation of the Church stated in *Evangelium Vitae* (72):

"In the case of an intrinsically unjust law, such as a law permitting abortion it is therefore never licit to obey it, or to 'take part in a propaganda campaign in favour of such a law, or vote for it'"

In 1995, the 4th United Nations (UN) sponsored World Women's Conference took place in Beijing, China. While the Holy See (the Vatican's diplomatic arm) was not a voting member of the UN, it was permitted to be an active participant (much like the delegates to the U.S. Congress representing territories and the District of Columbia). The Holy See delegation was headed by Mary Ann Glendon, an eminent professor of law on the Harvard University faculty. Supporting the Vatican delegation were non-government organizations (NGOs) that helped augment the very small Vatican delegation. A current St. Raymond parishioner was one of those NGOs.

One of the "jobs" of the Holy See NGO's was to sit in on the many subcommittee and sub-subcommittee meetings where much of the actual "work" of the conference took place... work to create a consensus document on women. During one of these meetings, the U.S. delegation was pushing a strongly pro-life Latin American nation to sign on to the U.N. statement affirming abortion rights. And then came the "or else!" "The U.S. will withhold an aid grant earmarked for your country."

Fast forward to 2024, another NGO reports that, "The Biden Administration is pressuring the government of Guatemala to withdraw its signature from the pro-life Geneva Consensus Declaration." Guatemala is one of the strongest pro-life countries in Central America. This Declaration initiated by the Trump Administration "promotes life, women's health, and family." The declaration "acknowledges that no international right to abortion exists." Thirty-six nations have signed the declaration.

How is this pressure being carried out? Last week the current president of Guatemala met with both the president and vice president of the U.S. and "Several measures were announced including an initial \$170 million in aid." Money talks!




