Pastor's Corner

This week has been very busy, and I'm afraid I ran out of time to write to you. So I turn my column over to my favorite writer.

Oremus pro invicem, Fr. De Celles

John Paul II, "Rosarium Virginis Mariae," October 16, 2002 (excerpt).

"Blessed Rosary of Mary, sweet chain linking us to God." 39...The Church has always attributed particular efficacy to this prayer, entrusting to the Rosary, to its choral recitation and to its constant practice, the most difficult problems. At times when Christianity itself seemed under threat, its deliverance was attributed to the power of this prayer, and Our Lady of the Rosary was acclaimed as the one whose intercession brought salvation....

Peace. 40....The Rosary is by its nature a prayer for peace, since it consists in the contemplation of Christ, the Prince of Peace, the one who is "our peace" (Eph 2:14). Anyone who assimilates the mystery of Christ – and this is clearly the goal of the Rosary – learns the secret of peace and makes it his life's project. Moreover, by virtue of its meditative character, with the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, the Rosary has a peaceful effect on those who pray it, disposing them to receive and experience in their innermost depths, and to spread around them, that true peace which is the special gift of the Risen Lord (cf. Jn 14:27; 20.21).

The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted. How could one possibly contemplate the mystery of the Child of Bethlehem, in the joyful mysteries, without experiencing the desire to welcome, defend and promote life, and to shoulder the burdens of suffering children all over the world? How could one possibly follow in the footsteps of Christ the Revealer, in the mysteries of light, without resolving to bear witness to his "Beatitudes" in daily life? And how could one contemplate Christ carrying the Cross and Christ Crucified, without feeling the need to act as a "Simon of Cyrene" for our brothers and sisters weighed down by grief or crushed by despair? Finally, how could one possibly gaze upon the glory of the Risen Christ or of Mary Queen of Heaven, without yearning to make this world more beautiful, more just, more closely conformed to God's plan?

In a word, by focusing our eyes on Christ, the Rosary also makes us peacemakers in the world. By its nature as an insistent choral petition in harmony with Christ's invitation to "pray ceaselessly" (Lk 18:1), the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult "battle" for peace can be won. Far from offering an escape from the problems of the world, the Rosary obliges us to see them with responsible and generous eyes, and obtains for us the strength to face them with the certainty of God's help and the firm intention of bearing witness in every situation to "love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Col 3:14).

The family: parents... 41. As a prayer for peace, the Rosary is also, and always has been, a prayer of and for the family. At one time this prayer was particularly dear to Christian families, and it certainly brought them closer together. It is important not to lose this precious inheritance. We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the Rosary...

The family that prays together stays together. The Holy

Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family together. Individual family members, in turning their eyes towards Jesus, also regain the ability to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God.

Many of the problems facing contemporary families, especially in economically developed societies, result from their increasing difficulty in communicating. Families seldom manage to come together, and the rare occasions when they do are often taken up with watching television. To return to the recitation of the family Rosary means filling daily life with very different images, images of the mystery of salvation: the image of the Redeemer, the image of his most Blessed Mother. The family that recites the Rosary together reproduces something of the atmosphere of the household of Nazareth: its members place Jesus at the centre, they share his joys and sorrows, they place their needs and their plans in his hands, they draw from him the hope and the strength to go on.

... and children. 42. It is also beautiful and fruitful to entrust to this prayer the growth and development of children. Does the Rosary not follow the life of Christ, from his conception to his death, and then to his Resurrection and his glory? Parents are finding it ever more difficult to follow the lives of their children as they grow to maturity. In a society of technology, of mass communications globalization, everything has become hurried, and the cultural distance between generations is growing ever greater. The most diverse messages and the most unpredictable experiences rapidly make their way into the lives of children and adolescents, and parents can become quite anxious about the dangers their children face. At times parents suffer acute disappointment at the failure of their children to resist the seductions of the drug culture, the lure of an unbridled hedonism, the temptation to violence, and the manifold expressions of meaninglessness and despair.

To pray the Rosary for children, and even more, with children, training them from their earliest years to experience this daily "pause for prayer" with the family, is admittedly not the solution to every problem, but it is a spiritual aid which should not be underestimated. It could be objected that the Rosary seems hardly suited to the taste of children and young people of today. But perhaps the objection is directed to an impoverished method of praying it. Furthermore, without prejudice to the Rosary's basic structure, there is nothing to stop children and young people from praying it – either within the family or in groups - with appropriate symbolic and practical aids to understanding and appreciation. Why not try it? With God's help, a pastoral approach to youth which is positive, impassioned and creative – as shown by the World Youth Days! - is capable of achieving quite remarkable results. If the Rosary is well presented, I am sure that young people will once more surprise adults by the way they make this prayer their own and recite it with the enthusiasm typical of their age group.

The Rosary, a treasure to be rediscovered. 43. Dear brothers and sisters! A prayer so easy and yet so rich truly deserves to be rediscovered by the Christian community....I look to all of you, brothers and sisters of every state of life...: confidently take up the Rosary once again.

CHURCH PERSECUTED

Working in the background, off the radar of most Christians who have deeply held beliefs whose rights are often trampled by local, state, and in the past, federal governments, are several legal organizations working diligently, holding these organizations accountable. Last Monday, before the U.S. Supreme Court, was a young lawyer from Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF), one of these law firms. He was defending Kaley Chiles, a licensed counselor in Colorado, against the State of Colorado which had a law prohibiting her from working with children who were confused about their biological sex.

In the case, *Chiles v. Salazar*, a young, but seasoned attorney, answered a wide range of questions from nine justices who were listening attentively and some asking very pertinent legal, medical, and counseling questions for nearly an hour. Jim Campbell, the chief legal counsel at ADF, argued the case. Put it simply, if parents in Colorado feel that they have a child who is confused about his/her biological sex and they seek professional help, they are out of luck, because Colorado bans what is known as "conversion therapy." Colorado isn't alone. There are 22 other states and the District of Columbia, who have similar bans. If Kaley loses before the court, she will lose her professional license.

So how did Mr. Campbell do? We probably won't know until the Court renders a decision sometime before June 2026. But we do know that the *Washington Post*, in an article posted online shortly after the oral arguments, ran the headline: "Supreme Court appears deeply skeptical of Colorado law that bans conversion therapy for gay and transgender minors." They noted that "the state ban infringes on the therapist's free-speech rights to counsel religious teens...in ways...consistent with biblical teachings."

What are the odds of ADF winning the case for their client (and Christian counselors throughout America)? Mr. Campbell is one for one before the Court before this case. ADF has 16 victories before the Court since 2011 representing pastors, churches, religious organizations, college students, family-owned businesses, pro-life pregnancy centers, town councils, and others. They have two more cases before the Court this term. Let us pray for these young lawyers who turn down opportunities to work for large prestigious law firms but help all of us protect our cherished religious freedoms.


