MARRIAGE: Couples wishing to marry must contact a parish priest at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Couples who are living together will be expected to live separately at least during the 3 months prior to the wedding.

OCIA: The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are instructed in the Doctrine of the Church and are prepared to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the Parish Office.

BAPTISM: Parents are requested to make arrangements with the Parish Office ONE MONTH in advance. Parents must participate in a one-session pre-Baptismal program and are encouraged to do so before the birth of their child. You must be REGISTERED in the Parish 3 MONTHS prior to the Baptism.

Pastor's Corner

Season of Advent. Today we begin the season of Advent, in preparation for Christmas. Every year most people forget that the Advent season is primarily about *preparing* for Christmas, and instead spend these weeks **pre-maturely celebrating Christmas**, and doing so from a largely secularized perspective. And then when the actual 3-week Christmas Season begins on *Christmas Day*, they put all the Christmas things away and go on with life!

This pre-mature celebration isn't necessarily a bad thing, as long as we see it as part of the strong influence of Christianity on our culture. Many Catholics see people around them start celebrating Christmas, and it's such a wonderful feast they (Catholics) get all caught up in it.

But it's not completely harmless. First of all, much of this early celebration is driven not by a Christian culture, but by commercial interests taking advantage of that culture. Sadly, much of this is nothing more than retailers playing on our emotional attachment to Christmas, in order to increase sales. Increasing sales is not a bad thing, but the reduction of Advent to a period of rampant commercialism/materialism/consumerism and emotionalism is a terrible thing. All but forgotten is the spiritual/faith preparation to celebrate the wonder of the birth of the Baby Jesus, our Creator come to redeem us from our sins.

Please don't let this happen to you this Advent. This is not to say you can't take part in wholesome "cultural" celebrations, as long as you make sure to also spend time *preparing* for the celebration of *the Day that changed the world forever*.

So I recommend that you do what Catholics have always done in preparing for Holy Days: **do penance**. In Advent this shouldn't take on anything like the severity of Lent, but we should do some small penance every day to remind us that nothing is more than Christ, and that everything we do is for Him.

So add **extra prayers** to your daily routine. **The Rosary** is an excellent addition to our prayers, especially meditating on the Joyful Mysteries, or at least praying one decade every day, meditating on one of the Joyful Mysteries. Maybe you could promise to attend (or lead!) one or more of the Parish Daily Family Rosaries in the Church!

Also **Reading Scripture** is an excellent way to renew your faith in Christ. Perhaps challenge yourself to read one of the Gospels beginning to end in Advent. Or perhaps read short passages daily from the Christmas-related texts: Matthew 1-2, Luke 1-2, John 1:1-17.

And of course, **charitable giving** is a great way to prepare for the gift of the Baby Jesus. While it is a fine practice to give presents to people we love, it is an even better practice to give to those who do not know us and cannot give anything back to us. So, make sure you make generous charitable gifts—either directly to those in need or to worthy charitable projects/institutions. **The parish Giving Tree** is an excellent way to do this, as are some of the special collections.

And don't forget to **receive the sacraments**. Consider coming to Mass and Adoration during the week, and make sure you go to Confession. As always, we will have confessions every weekday evening during Advent, which means **confession is available every single day during Advent** (except Christmas Eve). Also, we've **added a 7pm Mass to every weekday EXCEPT THURSDAYS (so M, T, W, F)**: why not commit to come to at least one (extra) weekday Mass every week of Advent?

Most importantly, **live the life that**

Christ came to give us: make every day about loving God with all your heart, mind, soul, and strength, and your neighbor as yourself. Follow the 10 Commandments, live out the Beatitudes. Forgive others, and be kind, patient, generous, and encouraging. Love one another as Jesus, who out of love for us stripped himself of the glory of heaven to be born in a cold manger, loves us.

Also: take part in the **many special events and liturgies** scheduled in the parish this Advent. Please keep the **insert** of the **Schedule of "Advent & Christmas 2025 Events"** from last week's bulletin somewhere central in your house. In particular, consider:

-- **Lessons and Carols.** Next Sunday, December 7, I invite you to join me, the lectors, the choir and 300 or 400 of your fellow parishioners for "Lessons & Carols" at 7:00 pm. This is a wonderful program of beautiful Advent music and Scripture readings. Some people think "Lessons" means I'm going to give a lecture or something. Not at all. "Lessons" is simply an old English term for readings from Scripture. By weaving together prophetic readings from the Old Testament and pre-nativity readings from the Gospels, the readers lay out God's breathtaking plan for the birth of His Divine Son. The choir adds to the atmosphere of joyful expectation by leading us in popular hymns and spreading their vocal wings in leading us in carols and a few more complicated choral pieces—they are AMAZING. And afterwards there will be an opportunity for joyful fellowship at a short reception (with delicious seasonal refreshments). This is **really a wonderful evening—you'll have a great time**. Every year the crowd gets bigger because everyone who comes loves it. Please join us.

"Advent Series." The last few years the Advent Series has been incorporated into a Holy Hour in the Church. This year we're going back to the Parish Hall where Fr. Bergida will give 3 one-hour talks on each of the Thursdays of Advent. His topic will be "The Eucharist." As you know, Father has a Licentiate in Sacred Liturgy, so he's a real expert on the history, development, doctrine and traditions surrounding the Eucharist. I'm looking forward to hearing his talks, and I hope to see you there,

beginning this Thursday, December 4, at 7pm. Notice that this is the time we have our extra Masses on the other weekdays of Advent this year, but **I didn't schedule Masses for Thursday evenings** so that you could all attend the Series.

"Rorate Caeli" Mass. Once again Fr. Bergida will celebrate the Rorate Caeli Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday, **December 20 at 6:30 am**. This Mass begins just before dawn with **only candlelight**, according to the ancient Advent custom, with the contrasting light and darkness reminding us of the meaning of Advent and the coming ("adventus") of the Light of the world. As the Mass proceeds and dawn breaks, the church becomes increasingly brighter with the light of the rising sun, symbolizing the birth of Christ, born of the Blessed Virgin Mary. If you want a preview, go to our website on initial the pop-up menu click "WATCH MASS (Livestream and Archive)," and on the next page click "Rorate Caeli Mass 2024."

CHURCH PERSECUTED

The dominos are beginning to fall on transgenderers participating in women's sports. The NCAA recently banned men who now claim to be women from participating in women's sports. The International Olympic and Paralympic Committee followed suit. A United Nations report revealed that "by 30 March 2024, over 600 female athletes in more than 400 competitions have lost more than 890 medals in 29 different sports" to transgender competitors."

Now the U.S. Second Circuit Court of Appeals has reversed an earlier decision by a lower court ordering a school be banned from the Vermont Principals Association (VPA), which regulates extracurricular activities in middle and high schools in Vermont. In *Middle Vermont Christian School v. Saunders*, the school was originally banned from participating in VPA activities because it forfeited a basketball game in which the opposing team had a "transgender" athlete. Middle Vermont, a Christian academy, was thus prohibited from participating in sports against VPA schools or activities such as science fairs, plays, and other non-sporting activities at VPA schools due their Christian principles.

The school cited the First Amendment's Free Exercise clause in which the Middle Vermont school would have to "accept transgender competitors as female, contradicting their Christian beliefs." The federal district court denied Middle Vermont's request for a preliminary injunction allowing them to retain their eligibility to participate in such activities, but on appeal, the Second Circuit reversed the decision.

"At the heart of its analysis, the Second Circuit determined that the plaintiffs were likely to succeed in showing that the 'VPA's decision was indeed accompanied by official expressions of hostility to religion.' The Court also found that VPA "ignored the detailed procedural requirements governing its disciplinary process...[and] flouted its own rules."

Next January the U.S. Supreme Court takes up two cases involving states that have banned transgender athletes from participating in women's sports. Last month the Supreme Court heard arguments and seemed favorably inclined to overturn a Colorado ban of therapists from counseling minors who come to them with gender dysphoria. The dominos are beginning to fall.
