
 We will complete our Introduction to the New Testament focusing on the Corpus of John, followed by a detailed study of the Synoptic Gospels

My Long-Term Bible Study Plan


- After completion of the Synoptic Gospels, we will begin a detailed study of:

- Prerequisites
- M.A. in biblical studies or a degree closely related to this field
- Nine credits in advanced Hebrew
- Nine credits in advanced Greek

Doctor of Philosophy in Biblical Studies

- Program
- A minimum of 30 credit hours beyond the M.A.
- 12 credits in exegetical seminars (in the major Testament).
- 9 credits in seminars in the minor Testament.
- 3-credit doctoral seminar, "Textual Criticism of the Bible."
- 6 credits in exegesis or related areas such as theology, archaeology, Semitics, the Ancient Near East, ancient languages
 - OT specialist: Aramaic, Syriac, Arabic, Ugaritic, or Akkadian
 - NT specialist: **Aramaic, Coptic, or Syriac** and one may find value in **Latin**.
- Intermediate knowledge of a third ancient language equivalent to one year of study.
- Reading and comprehension knowledge of **German and French** in accordance with School norms.
- A comprehensive doctoral examination.
- Doctoral guidance as needed.
- Completion and successful defense of the dissertation.

New Testament Timeline

- 30-33 Jesus' public ministry
- 33-100 Beginning of the Kingdom of God (the early Church)
- 45-49 Paul's 1st missionary journey
- 49-52 Paul's 2nd missionary journey
- 50 Apostles and Paul meet in Jerusalem for 1st council
- 50 Matthew's Gospel written in Aramaic
- 53-58 Paul's 3rd missionary journey
- 59-60 Paul's imprisonment in Caesarea

Timeline (Cont)

- 60-61 Paul's 4th journey (in chains) to Rome
- 64 Beginning of the "Roman Persecution" by Nero
- 64-67 Mark's Gospel written just before the martyrdom of St. Peter
- 62-63 Luke's Gospel most likely written from Rome
- 62-68 Acts of the Apostles written by Luke
- 68 Peter and Paul martyred in Rome
- 98-100 John's Gospel written from Ephesus
