- Revelation 11:6-7 "They have power to shut the sky, that no rain may fall...and conquer them and kill them"
 - By the fourth century, we begin to see commentaries attempting to explain these two witnesses
 - Some speculate that these are images of Elijah (stopped
 - the rain) and Moses (turned the water of Egypt into blood) as they appeared at the transfiguration with Jesus
 - Some see them as Jesus representing Elijah and the apostle representing Moses
 - These two witnesses were prophesying about the coming destruction of Jerusalem (70 AD)

 In the end, what we see here in Revelation is a reference to something that will happen in 70 AD in preparation in which God sent some sort of prophetic witnesses to prepare His people for the coming chastisement

- Revelation 11:8 "and their dead bodies will lie in the street of the great city which is allegorically called Sodom and Egypt where the Lord was crucified"
 - This may mean that the two witnesses will be killed
 - Obviously, the city is Jerusalem as it was the place where Jesus was crucified

- Revelation 11:19-12:1 "Then God's temple in heaven was opened,... And a great portent appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve starts"
 - We just blew passed the chapter division!
 - Father reminded us that chapter (added by a 12th century bishop) and verse (added during the Protestant Reformation) divisions were not in the original texts
 - This is an example of a poor division
 - In Revelation 11, John is telling us one thing and then in **Revelation 12**, he will give us another thing in the same way

- Father reminded us that the Ark of the Covenant was supposed to be in the Holy of Holies as it contained the throne upon which God sat
- The ark was made of acacia wood (very hard wood found in the desert, near Mount Sinai, good for building)
- It was covered with gold on the inside and outside with a golden cover upon which two carved golden cherubim were placed
- Inside, it held the two stone tablets, containing the 10 Commandments (Exodus 25)
- Here, we see the connection between the acacia wood as something of the earth and the gold which was obviously something of beauty

Revelation 12

- In **Revelation 12**, we have a woman clothed with the sun as a parallel to the gold
- This was because she was going to become the Ark of the Covenant
- In the Old Testament, God's word was placed on stone tablets which became the first material realization of God's Word (making the word physical)
- Here, the Word of God takes on human flesh and resides in the new ark

- This fulfills Jeremiah 31:31* and Ezekiel 36:24*
- Just as we had the word on stone tablets, we now have it in the flesh of mankind in Jesus Christ
- So, the Ark of the Covenant that is going to house the Word of God, is going to carry it (or bear it) in the womb of a woman clothed with the sun (not in a gold covered box of acacia wood)
- The sun is the symbol of purity and beauty
- So, John gives us a New Testament image with an Old Testament background by which we can understand it
- He is showing us that Mary is the new Ark of the Covenant

- Luke makes a similar point about Mary as the Ark of the Covenant in Luke 1:26-38*
- She goes to the hill country of Judea and stays with Elizabeth for three months (which fulfills 2nd Samuel 6:11* where we see the ark in its similar travels of Mary)
- Both John and Luke make it clear that Jesus is the Word made Flesh
- Also, that the word of God resided in the Ark of the Covenant and therefore, inside of Mary is the living Word of God

- John's gospel clearly tells us that Mary is the mother of Jesus
- Then, he says in Revelation 12 that she was crowned with 12 stars
- This should remind us of the story of Joseph's dream in Genesis 37:9-11*
- Further, we can ascertain that Mary was Queen of Heaven
 - At this point the temple was in heaven and she has a crown of 12 stars which was the symbol of the 12 tribes of Israel

- Thus, this second image is of the identity of the child who is to come
- Mary was housing the word of God in the flesh
- Jesus is understood in the New Testament as the Word of God
- But, he is also understood as the fulfillment of the long awaited Christ (Mashiach - Hebrew for Messiah, the anointed one); the human king of Israel
- Father reminded us of the story of Israel asking God for a human king (resulting in Saul, David, and Solomon)

- In 2nd Samuel 7:8-14*, God promised that David's dynasty would last forever
- So, at this point, Israel was waiting for the return of the human king and for the divine king
- A heavenly and an earthly king
- Jesus was both (as seen in Matthew and Luke's infancy narratives)
- Father said that the connection of this to the 12 stars is the of the queen mother (*gebirah*) in the Old Testament

- A queen mother (gebirah) was called "the mighty woman" as seen in Proverbs 31 where she gives advice to her son the king
- A crown of 12 stars (means that Jesus in her womb was not only the Word of God, but also the long awaited messiah)
- The following text will further clarify this
