| Motion: All things must be set into motion, by another moving object                                    | There must have been something<br>that moved first, on its own,<br>setting all else into motion                 | God is the first mover                                |
| Cause & Effect: For something to happen, or exist, something else must cause it to do so                | There must have been one thing that existed before a cause  | God is the first cause, everything else is the effect |
| <u>Transition</u> : All things are in transition between existing and not                               | there must have been something<br>that always existed, since there<br>cannot be a time where nothing<br>existed | God is that which always existed                      |
| <u>Degree</u> : All things are degrees of<br>the perfect form (Plutonic Forms-<br>Allegory of the Cave) | For goodness to exist, there must<br>be a perfect, complete goodness,<br>from which all other goodness<br>comes | God is the complete goodness                          |
| Design: The world is too perfectly ordered, for it to have come from chaos without a plan               | There must have been a designer for the world, and all the things in it   | God is the ultimate designer                          |
